ENGAGEMENT

MEETINGS The Engagement Working Group had a full-team hui this month to organise the upcoming Clinical Leadership Forum. Half of the team also met in person whilst participating at the recent NZMSA Conference GROW.

CLINICAL LEADERSHIP FORUM The Clinical Leadership Forum is planned to occur on the 28 to 30 July 2023 in Ōtepoti. Please mark your calendars and keep a look out for the first-come first-served ticket release on 8 June at 8pm! The event kaupapa is 'clinicians caring for the climate'. 30 UoA and 30 UoO students will be welcomed to Arai Te Uru Marae and the University of Otago Hunter Centre where the activities will include:

- 1. Volunteering to actively protect the local whenua;
- 2. Environmental policy navigation (with Professor Simon Hales and the leaders of Ora Taiao);
- 3. Media training workshop (with Andrew Patterson);
- 4. Emergency communication training (with Tori Prendergast);
- 5. Workshops on many other essential topics like psychiatry, karakia, and Pacific Health.
